

Rose Cottage, Main Road



- Section: A single unit two storey semi-detached building with door to left-hand-side. One window at first floor level and two, one small and one larger, on the first floor.
- **Period:** Late 18th to early 18th Century.
- **Walls:** Rough stone loosely coursed. The roof has been raised and the extension stonework is clearly visible as rows of larger stones, quite different to the rest of the wall.
- **Roof:** The roof is pan-tiled and has a row of stone flags laid at the edge of the eaves under the bottom row of pan-tiles. There are two chimneys at either end of the roof, one being at the east gable end. The west end of the building is attached to next residence (Sundial Cottage).
- Windows: Two large four pane sash windows to the west of the wall, both with ashlar sill and the first floor with ashlar lintel. The upper window has no lintel and has been incorporated into the roof extension. The window situated above the door is a smaller four pane sash wooden window and has both ashlar sills and lintels as well as a stone architrave. This window is located below the roof extension and is probably an original window.
 - **Door:** The wooden door has ashlar surrounds and is topped by an semicircular ashlar crown.
