Galsworthy House



- Section: A two-storey three bay detached building with central doorway, three upper windows and two cantered bay windows on the ground floor. Attached to the east gable end is a two storey barn that has been converted into a residential extension.
- Period: Mid- 18th Century
- **Walls:** Coursed ashlar blocks and quoins. The west gable end has been rendered. The attached barn is of rough stone.
- **Roof:** Pan-tiled roof has H-shaped kneelers terminating at the ashlar coping and there is a raised verge to the west. The outbuilding is also of pan-tiling with a plain close verge. There are two gable end chimneys at either end of the main building with brick tops.
- Windows:

There are three 19th Century plate glass sash windows with four upper panes and one large lower pane on the first floor. All have ashlar lintels and stone sills. On the ground floor are two cantered bay slash windows with moulded architraves and slate roofs.

The attached building has an upper boarded window with wooden lintel and ashlar sill. The window on the ground floor has eight upper panes with a single sash below, with ashlar lintel and sill.



Door:



The central door has a wooden and glass porch with slate roof with ornamental ridge cresting tiles. There is an ornamental frosted window with the house name inserted above the porch door.

Points of interest:

Ashlar front wall with wrought-iron railings.
