News from the parish council Temporary road closures 1 Scotch Corner

The Highways Agency is going to resurface Scotch Corner roundabout from 14-28 May. The work will be done overnight from 8.00 – 6.00. From time to time they will have to close the A6108 Richmond and Middleton Tyas junctions and diversions will be signposted through local roads.

2 Kneeton Lane

Kneeton Lane will be closed from 2 - 10 June to enable contractors to put in a tunnel for the conveyor to take stone from Middleton Lodge to Barton Quarry. The tunnel will be under the road near Under Kneeton and the Lodge Gates. The road will be closed from the Lodge entrance (Cricket Field) and the Barton road junction. It is hoped that people will not have too much trouble getting about over the Jubilee weekend.

Copper cable thefts

PC John Wilbor attended our April meeting and told us it is very difficult to prevent such thefts happening as the Police cannot be everywhere at all times. BT do have some form of alarm system on some of their cables but whether they are going to put one on the cable between the Barton exchange and Middleton Tyas we do not know. PC Wilbor again stressed the importance of remaining vigilant and reporting anything suspicious to the Police on101 or 999 in an emergency.

Sandy is putting in a huge amount of time getting to grips with the financial picture and drawing up a financial plan for the next year and onward.

Church News Letter from Rev Geoff Spedding

Further changes are afoot in the East Richmond Team Ministry - yes – again!

At the end of March, we were given the following announcement to make regarding a new appointment for my wife, Lesley :

The Revd Lesley Anne Cheetham, presently Vicar of Easby, Brompton-on-Swale, Bolton-on-Swale and Skeeby in this diocese, to be Chaplain at Overgate Hospice, Elland, in the diocese of Wakefield.

In the normal run of things, it is likely that Lesley's departure from N Yorkshire and the beginning of her new post will take place in late June.

As you may well know, I have been granted leave of absence for May, June and July. On my return, I will be able honour my commitments to ERTM, both taking planned weddings, and sharing the Sunday services until the end of September. This will give opportunity for David Lewis to take some holiday before the winter season opens up.

My last Sunday will be 30 September, which will be one of our 5th Sunday United Services – venue to be decided. So it will be a chance for me to bid farewell to many of the Team together on that occasion.

The time has rocketed by! Three years!! And then, very suddenly, it all comes to an end. I had thought until just a few weeks ago that I would be returning to ERTM on an open-ended basis after my time away. Now, Lesley's appointment has hastened the time of my retirement proper. It's really important for us to be able to move to West Yorkshire, as Lesley's parents both turn 90 this year; neither of them is in particularly good health – Mother's mobility and sight is poor, and Father has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's, so they are going to need a good deal of support in the immediate future; and Lesley is the only surviving child! So this opportunity has come just at the right time and place for us.

It will mean our removal to West Yorkshire – to a house high on the hills above Halifax. I'm going to have to learn how to garden at altitude (about 1000ft) – a big change from Swale-side! But I'm looking forward to dog-walks on the hills! I'm sure there will be plenty of opportunity for good-byes later in the summer.
