Temporary road closure Kneeton Lane

Our Memorial Hall belongs to **you**, the residents of Middleton Tyas.

After the First World War the residents of the village wished to build a hall as a memorial for those from this parish who fought in the Great War and as a thanks offering for those who returned in safety.

The land to build the hall was kindly donated for this purpose, and the residents provided the finances for the building which sits on the land. The hall has five trustees, but a management committee deals with the day-to-day running of the hall.

Since 1931 residents have formed a management committee which has kept the hall functioning and because of all this hard, dedicated work done in the past for which we are grateful, the hall is what it is today.

Now it is our turn to keep the good work going for future generations.

MTOC?

This could be the acronym for Middleton Tyas Oil Club which as yet, does not exist, you may have read of such schemes in the press or are aware of the Moulton Oil Club. If you use oil to heat your home you could buy it for up to 8p a litre less if you joined a bulk-buying group within the village. The larger the order the lower the price. The minimum order would always be 500 litres (by law). For those who burn oil in Agas the necessary additives would be provided.

I am new to the village and have to heat my house with oil. I am not connected to oil companies in any way. The system would be most efficient if it operated solely by e-mail as it could get cumbersome if numerous telephone calls had to be made.

If enough people respond I will then book the Memorial Hall and we can meet to discuss the practicalities of running such a system for our mutual benefit.

Letter from Canon Rachel Stowe

A Diamond Jubilee is a rarity few of us are likely to experience again. For those of us born in the reign of our Queen's grandfather, George V, it can be a good excuse for a real old nostalgia-fest. My diary for February 6 1952 reads: 'King George VI dies suddenly. Everyone v shocked. Straw lorry comes. Tractor (my much loved little grey Ferguson) conks out. Concert put off.' I was then the same age as my eldest granddaughter is now. And so I think – what sort of a world are we, sixty years on, passing on to her and her contemporaries?

In 1952, seven years after the end of the second world war, rationing of sweets and chocolate still existed. There was no teenage fashion; we girls were clones of our mothers,

boys of their fathers, though this was soon to change. Our highlights were the village hall Saturday night 'hop' (dance) or a week's holiday at Scarborough or Blackpool, few crossed the English Channel. We travelled by bike, bus or train. For many, a telephone was something in a red kiosk; mobiles and computers were not even dreamt of. But there was a great feeling of optimism at a new Elizabethan age.

Churchwise, Geoffrey Fisher was Archbishop of Canterbury; George Armitage Chase was Bishop of Ripon and they seemed remote and lordly figures. Few clergy had more than one parish; most churches had robed choirs and Sunday Schools. Hats and gloves for women and best clothes for all were essential.

Sixty years has seen many dramatic changes. Dread diseases such as Polio, TB and

smallpox are now treatable; we are living about 10 years longer, our ageing multi-cultural population has increased by 13 million. Our children are now taller and are educated for longer. £1 in 1952 equals £25 now; car ownership has increased almost a tenfold, home ownership has doubled. But parishes have been grouped in teams, many village post offices, schools and pubs closed, most adults work away from the village. Former farmworkers' cottages have been 'gentrified' by the affluent retired; new houses are of the 'executive' type. Are we happier? Or better people? In the 1950's almost everyone in the village knew their neighbours and would join in special events; now many live a 'privatised' existence and are rarely seen.....

So, as we celebrate the long reign of a respected and faithful monarch who has dedicated her life to our well-being – yes, our bodies and minds are better fed, but - as cars and computers and leisure opportunities proliferate and churches and chapels increasingly risk closure - are our souls shrinking? And what does this do and say to our young people?

Enjoy the celebrations and thank God for our Queen.
