Unfortunately there has been another property burglary in the village. Ironically at the September of Richmondshire Area Committee meeting the new Area Police Superintendent, Andy McMillan stated there had been a 10% reduction in crime on the previous year's figures. He reminded people to be constantly vigilant and to follow the slogan - Lock it or Lose it – and to routinely lock up sheds outbuildings, homes and vehicles.

The police also suggest that if you are going out, even during daylight hours, it is a good idea to leave some lights and a radio on. If they think someone may be at home, opportunistic thieves are more likely to leave your property alone.

Neighbourhood Watch

Another scam has come to light this month. This one arrives by post and claims that there is an intestate estate somewhere left by someone with the same surname as you and you stand to be left some money if you just get in touch with the sender of the letter, no doubt supplying some bank details as you do so. The old adage that, if something seems too good to be true it almost certainly is, applies here. Disregard any such letter. The only concerning bit is where the sender has got your full name and address from.

Last month we carried a message from PC John Wilbor about the importance of asking to

see a proper Pedlar's Licence from anybody who comes to your door selling. PC Wilbor says that rather than just ringing 101 and, if he is not available, leaving a message for him, what you should do is ring 101 and say that you want to report a suspect person knocking on doors. That way a unit can be directed to attend the area immediately and there is a better chance of catching the offender.

If you want to contact PC Wilbor you can do so by dialling 101, then pressing option 2 and asking for him by his full name or collar number. (See below). Church News

Letter from Rev David Lewis The two basic questions:

So Christmas approaches once again – the season of Carol Services and parties, turkeys and tinsel, mistletoe and mince pies. And with any luck they might put one or two decent films on the television as well.

One of my favourite films from yesteryear has to be 'The Eiger Sanction' starring Clint Eastwood and set in Switzerland. It is a thriller with an absolutely ludicrous plot and, dating from the 1970's, the jokes are by no means all politically correct. But the mountaineering sequences, including those filmed on location on the North Face of the Eiger, are truly spectacular. Clint Eastwood actually did the climbing and stunts for his character in the film, without using a double. At one stage during the filming tragedy struck. Two stuntmen were ascending a rope when the one in front dislodged a large boulder. It fell and killed his colleague below. According to Eastwood's account the filming was immediately stopped. Lots of little men in suits flew in from the United States waving pieces of paper and making a fuss. Meanwhile the actors gathered in a huddle. "What do we do now?" they asked.

It strikes me that this is the classic situation that confronts us repeatedly in church life. Having been a clergyman for nearly a quarter of a century I have seen plenty of situations (and no end of crises) in numerous churches and parishes. But with almost any scenario you can boil it down to two basic questions:

- 1. Where is God in this?
- 2. What are we going to do next?

Beyond those two questions, the rest is mostly just details.

When Christmas is over and we are moving into a new year, maybe these are the questions we should ask ourselves. Classic questions we can pose to ourselves as individuals, but also as churches and PCC's. Questions that could legitimately be asked of the East Richmond Team Ministry, or indeed of the Church of England as a whole.

Of course the tendency in a lot of cases is to jump to the second question and ignore the first one. However, this is unlikely to lead to good or happy results. Pure activism (especially of the brainless or feverish variety) is unlikely to lead to any genuine growth of the Kingdom of God. For that matter, if Clint Eastwood and his companions had considered *both* questions, they might have produced an even better film.
