Launch of the Pop-Up Pop-In Shop

Things usually go very quiet after Christmas and the New Year but this year the social life seems to be kicking off again earlier than usual. There's a quiz, a talk, Valentine's Day and Mothers' Day to celebrate at Middleton Lodge and the Cricket Club Dinner Dance coming up. Find out more about those in this month's issue. There's also a new regular event, which with your help, will become a regular feature.

That's the Pop-in Coffee Shop which was launched last month by the Village Shop. Every Thursday, for an initial six months, there's a pop-in coffee shop going on in the Memorial Hall from 8.45 to 11.00. Why 'pop-in'? Well, the fact that the shop and post office are there at all greatly increases the likelihood that if you go out in the morning you will run into somebody you know. The Pop-in Coffee Shop just gives you the opportunity to build on that and have a bit of a chat with somebody in the warm and with a cuppa thrown in for good measure.

Early customers are likely to be parents who have just dropped their children off at school. It's a chance to have a chat, read their e-mails (there's free wifi available) and let the pre-school kids have a run around with their friends in the warm. After that, it's up to you. Just call in any time before 11.00, have a chat and a cup of the cheapest coffee in town, (£1 a cup and free re-fills with a biscuit and juice for the children thrown in for good measure), catch up with friends, check out the special offers in the shop, browse the free Buy/Sell/Swap board, even put your toe in the small enterprise world! That's it! Got the tiniest germ of a business idea? There's a free 'Over to You' table where you can sell or promote your own products or business idea or just bring something you feel strongly about to a waiting world.

The Pop-up Coffee Shop isn't intended to be a great money-spinner for the shop. It's just making more of the fact that the shop and post office are a social hub for the village. ### Looking for help?

Do you need help for your self or for a loved one?  
St John's Community Centre at Catterick Garrison  
currently has vacancies for the following services:

#### **DAY CENTRE (Monday/Wednesday and Friday)**

Offers a place to meet new people, have a cooked lunch and join in the daily activity. Transport is provided on an adapted minibus. Other services at the centre include assisted showers, hairdressing and acupuncture.

### ASSISTED SHOPPING

Fortnightly service. Clients are collected and returned to their homes in an adapted minibus. They are assisted throughout by a driver and a support worker. After shopping, clients meet in the supermarket café before returning home. Cost is £4.10p per trip.

### INTERNET SHOPPING

Service for elderly or disabled who are house bound or find mobility a challenge. A volunteer will attend their home and carry out an online shop with Tesco having the groceries delivered directly to the clients home. No need to have a computer or internet access as this will be provided by the volunteer. Cost £1 per visit.

### SITTING SERVICE

Service for those who care for a dependant in their own home. A volunteer will sit with a person allowing their carer time to themselves. The amount of time is negotiable but is generally for 2 or 3 hours per week. Cost is £2 per hour.

All staff and volunteers are trained and vetted.

### Are you on the radar?

Research shows that only about a third of British purchasers register all of their domestic appliances with the manufacturer, leaving many thousands of owners virtually untraceable if a safety repair is required.

To combat this, the Association of Manufacturers of Domestic Appliances (AMDEA) has launched a new web portal ([www.registermyappliance.org.uk](http://www.registermyappliance.org.uk)) designed to make it quicker and easier for the public to register all of their appliances by providing access to the registration pages of 47 leading brands.

As part of the 'Fire Kills' campaign, North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service (NYFRS) is encouraging people to use 'Register my appliance', to provide up-to-date, accurate, contact information so manufacturers can issue (*Continues on page 8*)

*(Continues from page 5)* on safety updates or repair notifications to the right homes. Over time consumers will also be encouraged and provided with the means to amend their details if they move house, sell or give an appliance away.

Douglas Herbison Chief Executive, AMDEA says, "Domestic appliances have never been safer and over 100 million large appliances are in use in our homes, many running for ten or many more years. The incidence of safety actions is very low (between 6 -10 recalls a year) but, unlike cars, if manufacturers need to make a free safety adjustment they have no way of tracing the majority of affected models. 'Register my appliance' aims to help our industry to act swiftly, to contact owners, if a fault is discovered in a particular batch of products."
