

## Middleton Tyas Defibrillator Project

### Donations

Thank you to everyone who has already sent a donation to the Community Heartbeat Trust (CHT) towards the cost of a defibrillator for our village. Some concern has been voiced over whether the donations are being directed to the charity generally or to a specific fund for Middleton Tyas. Please be reassured that any money received by the CHT from anyone in this village is being allocated specifically to us. I would like to remind residents that, should they prefer to make a donation in cash directly to the Parish Council for this purpose, it is possible to do so in the Village Shop, where cash is being collected on our behalf. The shop also has some spare envelopes if you have mislaid the one that was included with last month's Village News. All donations will be added to our final total. If you haven't already donated, please could I ask that you do? A defibrillator could buy the time that ultimately saves someone's life – it really is that important.

### Public meeting

Martin Fagan, National Secretary of the Community Heartbeat Trust will be coming here on Wednesday 22 June for **an open meeting in the Memorial Hall at 2.00**. You are very welcome to come to that and have all your questions and concerns addressed.

Once we are in a position to install the equipment, there will be the opportunity to have some community awareness training for everyone who wishes to come. This will comprise a two-hour session run by the CHT, covering the issues surrounding the treatment of a patient in the community. The informal session is specifically designed for rural communities to answer questions, give basic instruction and help potential rescuers feel confident about using the equipment.



### Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS)

Additionally, it is the intention of the Parish Council to work with the CHT to set up a Village Emergency Telephone System, or VETS. A third of all 999 calls are from lone rescuers and getting help to them quickly is important. VETS is a community-run system, and enables up to 10 residents to assist pending the arrival of the emergency services. After calling 999, a rescuer will call a unique telephone number to call our VETS helpers. Ten telephones of the volunteer VETS will ring simultaneously. The first one to respond will collect and bring the defibrillator to the patient and assist in CPR\*. We will be looking for volunteers to become VETS in future months.

*\*Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is a lifesaving technique useful in many emergencies where someone's breathing or heartbeat has stopped.*

## **Best Kept Village Competition**

Middleton Tyas and Moulton will both be entering, as usual, so here are some tips as to what the judges will be looking for:

- Public areas of grass are cut and well-maintained.
- Verges and other areas of grass outside people's houses are neat and cared for
- There are no weeds on roadsides, cracks in the pavement, between walls and pavements etc
- Hedges are tidy and well-maintained and garden walls and fences are tidy
- There is no evidence of litter
- No evidence of out-of-date notices on notice boards or telegraph poles
- Gardens are colourful and well-tended
- Evidence of people having gone the extra mile to make their community look attractive, so lots of pots, tubs and hanging baskets full of flowers
- Evidence of special village features, eg fountains, wells, statues, being well-cared for and, if appropriate, decorated for the summer.

## **How a spring clean could save your life**

North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue urge you to clear clutter that may be blocking possible escape routes in the event of a fire and make sure that family, guests and loved ones know how to get out, stay out and call 999 in the event of a fire.

Working smoke alarms are regularly the heroes in a fire, giving people the warning they need in time for people to get out. But blocked exits, locked doors or unfamiliar surroundings can shave vital seconds off your possible escape time. As little as two or three breaths of toxic smoke can leave you unconscious so every second counts.

- Think about how you would get out in the event of a fire. Making an escape plan and practising it will help to ensure that everyone can get out, stay out and call 999.
- Have an 'escape champ'. Nominate someone in your household, perhaps a child, to be the 'escape champ'. Role-playing escape routes often and giving children the responsibility to keep escape routes clear makes fire safety more engaging and fun.
- Fit at least one fire alarm at every level of your home so smoke can reach an alarm more quickly, giving you more warning time.
- Check your smoke alarms monthly. Smoke alarms that don't work won't save your life!
- Clear your escape routes so you can make a speedy exit.
- Keep your door and window keys in a known and accessible place. Make sure everyone knows where they are and can reach them easily.
