As you already know, we have a defibrillator installed outside the Memorial Hall which is accessible 24/7. We also have a team of local volunteers (VETS) who will help you to use the defibrillator if you need assistance. Now the two are linked up because we have a dedicated VETS telephone number, shown above. Ring this number from any mobile or landline and it will automatically ring round the dozen or so volunteers and the first one to pick up will come and help you. You should be aware that the VETS are providing a voluntary service. It is possible, though very unikely, that none of them would be available. They are not like, for instance, the ambulance service which is bound to respond to your call. VETS can help in providing interim care and resuscitation if necessary until the emergency services arrive. It's essential to ring 999 first.

Attached to this issue of the Village News is an envelope containing a fridge magnet and two key fobs so that you can always have the VETS number immediately to hand. Please put them on your fridge door or your key ring NOW and make sure everybody in your household knows about the defibrillator and the VETS number.

Remember that if you are with somebody who is unconscious or appears not to be breathing, the speed of your response can make a critical difference to their chances of survival.

- 1. Dial 999 from the emergency telephone on the defibrillator or any other telephone
- 2. Ring the VETS Emergency number from your mobile or any other telephone (the telephone on the defibrillator is **only** for 999 calls) or
- 3. Start using the defibrillator pack yourself following the step by step audio instructions, which are part of the package, until the emergency services arrive.


