#### **Ore-some Copper Belles WI**

Wind the bobbin up, wind the bobbin up, pull, pull...you get the idea. April's meeting taught us a lot more about the meaning/inspiration of the song we all know so well from childhood. We were of course learning about the art of bobbin lace making; the method of making lace by weaving threads held on bobbins (wooden batons) up and over, and down and under each other, then pinning them in place on the drum according to the pattern. Sounds easy but I'm not sure those of us who tried it out would agree. We quickly understood that a lot of patience and practise was required to produce the beautiful things that we saw. I think everyone there was in complete awe of what could be produced from weaving thin pieces of thread and the time dedicated to producing them. I have to be honest, prior to the evening I imagined doilies, table cloths and other things similar to the lace making my Grandmother used to do, but it was so much more than I could ever have imagined. There were beautiful dresses and bags embellished with intricate bobbin lace, and hats, pictures, even original portraits completely made using the craft. I could even tell who the portraits were of; they were so detailed and cleverly done. I was so pleased to have experienced what bobbin lace making is and felt very privileged and grateful to our host, Lucie Hamplová (Hana Buhlova's mum), for sharing her many wonderful pieces of art with us. **After** four and a half years at the helm, our Chairman Steve Hill has stepped down. Among the many changes he brought about were the new door, the refurbished Post Office and the revamp of the Memorial Garden, all paid for by grants. The members of the Committee, staff and volunteers would all like to give Steve a big thanks for his hard work and his time.

So, we are on the hunt for a new Chairman. The Committee at the moment stands at four plus a paid Treasurer. Jed has been on the Committee for many years, I've been Secretary for over four, Laura has done two years and Rhonda is our relative newbie.

1. The Chair of the Middleton Tyas Village Shop is responsible to the shareholders for:

- Ensuring the business is run in accordance with the Cooperatives Model Rules and following best practice in terms of Corporate Governance.

- Leading the Management Committee in providing strategic direction for the business.

- Ensuring that accounting is carried out with propriety and regularity.
- 2. Since the shop is run as a business for the benefit of the community, its aim is to break even financially. Income is collected largely from sales, but also from donations and fundraising events, and the chair has a key role in ensuring that, collectively, these activities balance the books at the end of each year.

My view as Manager (thought I'd get that in!), is that Liz and I need time now to get back on with getting the stock right. This will be the first financial year in a few years that there won't be any grants coming in and getting spent, so at the end of it we will get a much better picture of how we are doing in trading terms. It's a never ending task keeping up with what is selling and what isn't, deciding what to buy, what to stop buying, and trying to read people's minds...

**The** sugar tax came into effect on 6 April, meaning that some of our soft drinks will be going up in price as we replace stock. Any drink with 5-8g of added sugar per 100ml gets a 16p hike per litre, above 8g per 100ml gets a 24p hike per litre. The makers of Coca Cola have refused to change the recipe of their coke classic, so that's at least one price rise we'll see. Other companies are changing formulations to reduce sugar and thereby avoid the tax, so it's just a case of wait and see what drinks we sell will be affected. But, as with the rest of our stock, we remain committed to selling at Recommended Retail Price. Eee, it'll be crème eggs next.
