The Parish Council has a vacancy for a HANDYMAN to undertake various outdoor maintenance tasks within the Parish.

ALL TASKS will be outdoors and will include, but not be restricted to:

- Weed removal
- Litter picking

NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

New Chairman for the Parish Council

We are pleased to announce that, with effect from 10th May 2018, our new Chair of the Parish Council is Gordon Davies, who has been a Parish Councillor for some time. The outgoing Chair, Bob Davies, has agreed to be our Vice Chair to support Gordon through the first year of his tenure.

Members of the Parish Council would like to thank Bob for his valuable leadership and guidance as Chair over the last two years.

Village Handyman

Colin Watts, our current Village Handyman, has resigned from this post. We would like to thank Colin for all his hard work on behalf of all residents including those of us on the Parish Council. The Village is a nicer place in which to live due to his efforts.

Best Kept Village Competition 2018

As usual, we have entered the village into the 'Best Kept Village Competition' organised by Richmondshire Rotary Clubs. The judges will be touring the village during the first two weeks of July to see how we measure up against the other competitors. Marks are awarded for the general tidiness of the village, appearance of open spaces (such as the village Green), public buildings, pubs, car parks areas, etc. We understand that judges like to see flower displays such as hanging baskets and planters, as well as anything else which makes the village looks attractive and well maintained. If you can tidy up the area outside your own property by the end of June, that would be very much appreciated.

Development behind Kneeton Park

On Tuesday an Information Event on the above was held at the Memorial Hall for Residents. The Developer and Architect involved responded to the Parish Council's request for such a session. Many people attended and their comments were collated for further discussion. Cllr Mrs Samantha Perks, our Parish Councillor whose portfolio is Planning, has reported back to the PC that there are additional issues that we would welcome the opportunity to discuss with the RDC before final permission is given. These include the overall appearance of the development; the materials used; the apparent lack of parking; the ratio of smaller to larger dwellings; the possibility of a maintenance charge for owners of the properties; field access to the west for future potential development and the fact that there remains only one entry and exit along with other issues. A detailed letter from the Parish Council will be delivered to RDC and Angus Thompson, our District & County Councillor, who will be taking all of this forward by way of requesting a meeting with them in advance of planning permission being granted. More information will be provided as and when we have it.

Meetings with NYCC and A12LB about our Village

A meeting was held to try to sort the unacceptable appearance of our Village as we come to the end of the A1 development. The signage requires more work in order to stop HGVs attempting to use the Village as a through road and there are issues with the appearance in general following years of upheaval.

Trees, hedges and shrubs overhanging the pavement

May we remind you that you should not let the trees, hedges and shrubs in your garden overhang the public footpath? If residents report to the PC that overhanging greenery is hindering use of the footpath, the PC will report this to NYCC who, in turn, will come along and cut back the offending branches but will then send you an invoice for the work. You may wish to check your own boundary and get out the loppers and pruners before this happens! Thank you.

Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council is 14th June in the Memorial Hall at 19.10. All residents of the Village are welcome to join us.

Ore-some Copper Belles WI


