Bulb planting

I hope you all enjoyed the crocuses, snowdrops and daffodils we planted in the centre of the village last autumn. Fingers crossed they will all be up again next spring together with lots of snowdrops planted in the avenue up to the church and in the new graveyard.

I had hoped we would be planting again this Autumn but, alas, we are still having to wait for permission to go ahead. The plan is to plant at the new 'entrances' to the village. These are at the junction of the main village street and the access road to Moulton and at what is now the T-junction at the end of Kneeton Lane (formerly a sharp right hand bend.

We would like to plant both areas with daffodils and snowdrops and are also looking at the possibility of creating some wild flower meadows, funding permitting. There is still work to be done in both areas before they can be officially handed over to NYCC and, as these areas are both bigger than what we have tackled so far and we would need some mechanical assistance, we can't just slip out one dark night and get planting anyway! Fingers are very firmly crossed that this will all be sorted out by this time next year.



Having trained and worked as a professional florist for over 30 years, she now demonstrates and teaches how to use flowers in creative and inspiring ways. This wasn't a flower arranging session in the traditional sense that I, and many other members, thought we were going to experience. Instead, Lucy 'crafted' beautiful floral designs using flowers from the garden and through upcycling everyday items that most of us will have in our homes. She created an Autumn wreath, straw vases, an Autumn bottle art display and a hand tied bouquet using pages from a book for the framework. All very unusual ideas but simple to recreate for yourself. Lucy also taught us about floral art and showed us some of her creations which are displayed in hotels and restaurants around our area. Lucy had created impressive structures using wood, wire and straw and then embellished them with pretty flowers. It was more like a form of crafting with the display of flowers in an art form than flower arranging. Everyone was very enthusiastic to know more about everything that Lucy demonstrated to us, and I was certainly inspired to use the flowers in my garden to create something original.
