Now if anyone is interested in earning some extra pennies and likes to cook (or knows someone who might be), it would be great to have locally made ready meals for us to sell. If this rings your bell, toots your horn or shivers your timbers, then please come in and have a chat, or email me using the email address at the top. It would involve getting a hygiene certificate and undergoing occasional checks but we would supply the ingredients etc.

Where does the time go? Five years ago in August I started working at the shop as one of the two paid staff. gained an admiration for people who run shops like ours for a living - hats off to them. The hours, the work, the frustrations, the paperwork. The worry! Its all worth it though – most of the time...
