

SO, starting with the bad news for all those who haven't had a letter through the door – by the time you get this edition of the Village News, or on the 25th, whichever is sooner, our subPostmistress Dorothy will have retired and the Post Office in Middleton Tyas will have closed. I won't go through it all again, but we tried, four applicants tried, but it was just impossible to find a way to keep it open.

No news yet on an 'Outreach' service, which is someone who runs their own Post Office coming to the shop or the Hall once or twice a week for a few hours to keep some semblance of a service going. But don't forget the shop sells first and second class stamps and can give cashback of up to £50 after a £2 spend on a debit card. We will also buy out Dorothy's stock of envelopes, sellotapes, pritsticks etc.

The loss of the Post Office obviously will have an affect on the shop, but we will just have to wait and see how much. In the meantime, we have some extra space which we will have a think on what to do with. Nothing can be too permanent given that we may get an Outreach service, but if you have any ideas (polite ones), let us know.

One idea has been to allow people to rent the space on a Friday and/or Saturday for a small fee to have their own little bit of retail space to display and sell whatever it is they do – be it painting, crafts etc. Or we have a large folding display board that could be used for advertising. Fridays are our busiest days, and Saturdays gets a slightly different crowd in. Let me know if you are interested...

And in the meantime, if anyone wants a lovely, two year old Post Office counter, that'll be 50 quid please!

It would make a great desk, with plenty of space on top and shelving at the back...

WE are doing our stock take on Saturday 2 November, from 1.30pm, so if you are able to help, please do. All it involves is counting things...

CHRISTMAS is barrelling towards us and soon I'll put together the raffle hamper, this year featuring some generously donated items from Fortnum and Mason (gasp). All for a good cause – ie keeping the shop going – so please do have a go. Or two. £1 a ticket. Each ticket will also cover the other half of our raffle, the marvellous Christmas cake donated by Mary Parvin.

WE have been unable to host our Big Breakfast this year and as this was a great fund-raiser for our capital account – from which we pay for equipment renewal or repair – ideas would be appreciated for other fund-raising events you would be interested in coming to. The Memorial Hall is very kindly donating proceeds from the raffle at their quiz on 15 November to us, which will help, but obviously with the price of a new fridge or such like, we need to keep this account healthy.

If you are coming to the quiz, please note that the alcohol and snacks will be available from the shop during the evening. Yorkshire beers, lager and ciders, white, pink, red, bubbly wine and all manner of snacks...

WE will be doing hampers again this year – more details soon. For a small charge, we provide a basket - all you have to do is fill it with goodies from the shop and we wrap it for you. A great gift for the hard to buy for, or as a thank you, or whatever, while supporting your community shop into the bargain!

The Autumn term has begun very well, with our new starters settling in to school life here at Middleton Tyas and at Eppleby Forcett. It has been lovely to see new friendships being formed and beginning to flourish.

No closed questions allowed and a supportive, friendly but challenging approach required; it really was quite tricky to do. By the end though, some of us had opened our minds to new ideas and others had made promises to themselves to go home and do their WHAT next. It was a really interesting evening and a very useful technique to learn about; something all of us can use in our everyday lives.

Apologies to all those who were expecting a self defence session and a massive thank you to Craig for providing us with a fabulous alternative and for stepping in at such short notice.

Next month, all should be back on schedule with an evening of chocolate! Back by popular demand, Andrew Thwaites will join us to teach us more about chocolate, carry out some demonstrations and provide us with plenty of chocolate tasting.
