I was surprisingly saddenned the other week to send a 14 year old boy back to whence he came. He wasn't faulty, it was just time for him to go. I couldn't legally keep him anymore. Being German, he ran on time. We told him when we were going out, and there he was, by the front door, five minutes early. I miss the many pleases and thank yous, the tidy bedroom, the 'that was delicious'. I love my own 14 year old, I do, its just that the German spoke to me like I was human, rather than a parent. Ho hum.

So, to the serious stuff. If you need or choose to self-isolate, please do let the shop help you. You will not be a burden, we are all part of the same community. We can deliver items to you if you need them. If you are on your own, we can organise a daily phone call. Any help you want, please do not be shy in reaching out.

Either ring the shop – 01325 377198, or me at home – 01325 377434 or 07368 424343.

I have already had several offers of help, extra to the wonderful volunteers we have already, so don't worry about it being just me and a Granville bike, slogging up School Bank with a basketful of loo rolls...

We are already delivering to 6 or 7 customers, and have set up accounts for them so we are not dealing with money each time. Simply give us a cheque or cash, enough to cover a few deliveries, and we'll set you up with an account.

A couple of rest assureds now – we are not bumping up prices and, secondly, every staff member or volunteer you see in the shop is not only under 70, but are there entirely of their own choosing, to serve and help our community.

We have lots of puzzle books in stock if you get bored and I personally have loads of DVDs or jigsaws I am happy to lend out to stop you from going so stir crazy. Of course the BBC will let us off a few months of the licence fee (hahahaha) because filming new stuff will come to a screeching stop and we'll eventually be left with repeat after repeat (but they can show Poldark again, I'd let them off that). All books in the shop are free at the moment so come and have a browse.

We are facing the same stock issues as people heading for supermarkets only to find empty shelves. The cash and carry is fairly bare when we visit (which of course has nothing at all to do with the fact that Tescos now own Bookers and are of course not diverting stock to their own stores) but we are trying our best to keep stock levels as normal as possible – even if its not the brands we usually carry. And when they do have the important things in (loo rolls!), we too are limited to how many we can buy.

While this is all going on, we are closing off the old entrance to the shop and limiting the amount of customers in the shop at any one time to 3. Please use the garden entrance, be aware of social distancing when waiting to come in and when you are in. We are taking utmost care to keep the shop clean, including the doors/handles/card machine etc etc.

So take care, stay well, keep in touch and we'll see you on the other side. The other side of this, not the other other side, obviously.

Finally, a message to shareholders. Obviously we are not going to be able to have the AGM as normal. We are obliged to hold it within 6 months of the end of the last FY, which was October last year. What I will do is send out the accounts, a Chairman's message, the Treasurer's notes and any

other blurb that usually goes with it to all shareholders by the end of April. That'll be exciting. You'll just be glued to your inboxes or letter boxes now won't you?

### CORONAVIRUS

School News

Well the weather has certainly been diverse recently, with gale force winds, snow and more rain than we know what to do with but, dare we say it, Spring seems to have finally arrived!

Over at our Epplebly Forcett site the Pre-school children have been looking for the first signs of Spring and have noticed the snowdrops and daffodils are starting to bloom. They have talked about what plants need to grow and have planted some seeds. The children in Reception enjoyed flipping some pretend pancakes on Shrove Tuesday and recording their tossing scores. They have also been learning about Lent, which means Spring, and have talked about some special Lenten promises. In Year 1 the children have started their new class novel "The Pirate Cruncher" and have been making predictions about what might happen next in the story based on the illustration on the front cover. They were delighted to receive a letter from 'dastardly Captain Purple Beard and his band of cut-throat Pirates' asking if they wanted to join the crew! The children discussed reasons for and against this and came up with some very persuasive arguments! In Year 2 the children have been scientists, drawing and labelling the different parts of a plant. They have also been using their senses to write detailed and descriptive sentences about the islands they designed in English and have been making plans in DT to build their own pirate ships! The children have also been talking about how and why it is important to be healthy.

Over in Year 3 the children have been mathematicians, learning about measurement, length and perimeter and have been going round school measuring a variety of objects.

They have worked out that a million £1 coins stacked on top of each other would be 3km high! They have also begun reading their new class novel "Clockwork", a spooky story about automaton!

Meanwhile our Year 4 children been busy writing their own stories based on the characters and events in the book "Hugo Carbet". They have also been talking about Lent and setting personal Lenten goals to achieve during this time.

The children in both these classes have also been very busy rehearsing their Easter production, 'Daniel'. Our Year 5 and 6 children enjoyed a trip to Beamish Open Air Museum as part of their Industrial Revolution topic. They learned about the invention of the steam engine and how the expansion of the railways affected different people. They listened to various arguments and had to decide if they thought this was a good idea and whether they should invest in the new railway or not, giving reasons for their choices.

The Year 5 children have also been learning about Eco-systems, climate change and how things we do can

affect our planet. They produced some very persuasive posters explains how we can all help do our bit to save planet Earth.

We must say a big 'Thank You' to The Woodland Trust who have very kindly donated 130 saplings which the children have planted around the school grounds with the help of Mrs Booth and Mrs Clarke. The children and staff celebrated World Book Day by coming to school dressed as an historical character. Everyone had a

wonderful time and the costumes all looked amazing! We had a real array of famous characters including suffragettes, knights, Cleopatra, soldiers, various Queens, Florence Nightingale and we even had Jesus!

With the coronavirus closing schools across the UK, it may be a while until we can start sharing our school news with you all again. Stay safe everyone xx



With coronavirus Covid-19 we are now in a time where many of us are selfisolating and social distancing is a must for us all, so we need to be even more careful in how we stay safe and keep in touch.

There are a number of networks of volunteers popping up as well as unscrupulous people trying to take advantage of those who are alone and vulnerable. North Yorkshire Police have been in discussion with NYCC Local Resilience Forum, Ready For Anything and Major Incident Response Team about how they best administer spontaneous volunteers. However they recognise that communities are self-organising and know their communities best. Due to the potential risks to the public and organisation in coordinating volunteers in this setting without DBS checks and putting people at risk, they consider the best way forward is to speak with one voice and to sign post people to the following support and advice about

Sadly it has not taken long for coronavirus linked scams and dodgy claims to start, including protective face masks that never arrive or are not fit for purpose, and coronavirus-themed phishing emails to trick people into opening malicious attachments or revealing sensitive personal and financial details. Often they purport to be from research organisation's affiliated with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the World Health Organisation (WHO), claiming to be able to provide a list of coronavirus infected people in our area but to access the information you click a link to a malicious website or request for payment.

Coronavirus linked scams and dodgy claims are not just online. Trading Standards have been made aware that a company is putting flyers through our letterboxes here in Middleton Tyas, offering to deep clean the exterior of our homes, as a deterrent against the coronavirus, at a cost of £80. Based on advice from Public Health, Trading Standards believes that the company has made unsubstantiated and misleading claims and has instructed them to immediately stop. They urge everyone to be on the look out for this and other types of coronavirus scam, which prey on genuine worries and concerns in order to make quick money. If you have any information about this or any other coronavirus scam please do report it to Trading Standards.

Our application for the village to be a No Cold Calling Zone has been received by Trading Standards and they have said it will be actioned as soon as the coronavirus situation has settled. In the meantime, should we have a cold caller, we should ask to see a copy of their Pedlar's Licence. This is free of charge from any Police Station and if they are genuine sales people, they should have one and show it on demand. If not, advise them to go and get one. If the caller does not have a Pedlar's Licence or you are suspicious of them, phone the Police on 101 immediately and report the incident.

North Yorkshire Community Messaging is a free messaging system that allows us to register to receive the latest crime notifications and community news happening here in Middleton Tyas. You can tailor it for the type of the message you receive, your preferred channel (phone, text, or email) and the locations you want. You can get information on:



- Crime and other police incidents, including missing people and witness appeals.
- Rural policing, including crimes against farms and rural businesses.
- Anti-social behaviour.
- Road safety, including road closures and traffic updates.
- Neighbourhood news and events, such as invitations to public meetings.

To get started, visit www.nycm.co.uk and create an account, or download the phone app from your App Store.

The Police have also been using WhatsApp as another means of communicating and it proved invaluable in reducing quad bike thefts with several arrests made following local people contacting them through the various WhatsApp groups. There have been a number of poaching and curtain sided lorry thefts nearby and patrols were increased resulting in several arrests of individuals caught trying to steal items from parked lorries around the Barton and Scotch corner areas, as well as a number of men being given a dispersal order to leave Middleton Tyas on 16/01/20 as they were believed to be poaching.

In addition to all the above sources of information, Middleton Tyas Neighbourhood Watch keeps a page on Facebook with information relayed from various local sources, focusing on that which affects people in our village. If you wish to get in touch you can find us on facebook and "Send Message" or email us at neighbourhoodwatch@middletontyas.org.uk but if you see anything suspicious please report it immediately via 101 or if at the time you believe a crime is taking place call 999.
