## FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL ~

## Parish Precept for 2022-23

The Council has applied to RDC for the Parish Precept for the year from April 2022 to March 2023 at the same rate as this year, with no increase in the total amount. You may well find that a percentage increase is shown by RDC on your Council Tax bill when it arrives but that is because the actual amount you have to pay will depend on the number of residents who do pay, and that varies each year. (eg – if the Parish asks for £3000 one year and there are 300 residents, they would pay £10 each; if there are 250 residents the next year, they would have to pay £12 each for us to receive the same £3000.)

## **Double Yellow Lines**

Hopefully, the new yellow lines will keep the West End of the village free from parked vehicles, making this busy area safer. If you see anyone parking on the yellow lines, pavement or grass verge, you can report this (ideally with a time, date and photo of the vehicle and licence plate) to NYCC Highways Department via County Hall on 01609 780780.

## **Defibrillator Familiarisation**

Thank you very much to the 19 residents who attended the Defibrillator familiarisation training on 16<sup>th</sup> October. It is planned to hold these sessions annually, in conjunction with Yorkshire Ambulance Service, to update residents' skills. Thanks to YAS and also to Cllr Clare Lamb for organising the event.

## Vehicle Activated Speed sign – VAS

The VAS has now been installed and will flash at you if you drive above the **30mph speed limit**. Please drive carefully throughout the village, particularly in the central 20mph zone, and also near the School.

## **Play Park Refurbishment**

A reminder that the Play Park will be **CLOSED w/c 6<sup>th</sup> December 2021** to allow Kompan's contractors to install the new climbing net. For safety reasons, you will not be allowed to enter while work is underway.

## Resurfacing of the carriageway of Silver Street, Barton

The works include replacement of the full width of the road surface from the 30mph limit on the west of the village to St Cuthbert's Green. The works are currently programmed to commence on **Monday**, **22nd November** and are expected **to last for 3 weeks.** Please note that it will be necessary to close Silver Street in both directions to enable the surfacing work to be carried out safely. A signed diversion route will be in place. The works will be carried out between 0800 and 1800, Monday to Friday and the road closure will be in place between these times only. This may inevitably delay vehicular travel but we will endeavour to minimise the duration of the road closure where possible. *Hanson Contracting on behalf of NYCC*.

## **News from Neighbourhood Watch**

The overall good news is that crime around Richmond (and Middleton Tyas and Moulton in particular) remains low and the chances of being a victim of burglary are still very low in Richmondshire generally.

There have however been the following 'incidents of note' in October 2021:

# Our local police have drawn attention to the following scams that have been reported in recent months:

- Calls from Amazon stating you have credit on your account and that they wish to send you the money back. They will try to get you to do it on your computer, it won't work, and they will then ask to take control of your computer and then proceed to clear out your bank account.
- People ringing you purporting to be from the NHS asking you to pay money to get your COVID vaccination.

These people are very convincing and experts at what they do. They will usually sound very legitimate but please don't engage with them. Report any suspicious activity to the police.

# Bogus Police Officer/Family and Friend Fraud – from Andy Fox, Financial Abuse Safeguarding Officer:

In recent days, North Yorkshire Police have received reports of phone calls being made by fraudsters impersonating police officers. The victim is instructed to go to their bank and withdraw all their money from their account. They are told a police officer will attend their home address to collect the money once it has been withdrawn for safekeeping. The victim is told to lie to the bank if they are challenged as to why they are wanting to withdraw such a large quantity in cash.

Remember: The police or bank will NEVER ask you to withdraw or transfer money to a 'safe' account set up by the police or bank.

- If you are ever told to lie to the bank as to why you are doing a particular transaction, it is a scam.
- If you are in doubt, terminate the call immediately.
- Call 101

Another scam is where the victim receives a message either on WhatsApp or Facebook Messenger from someone claiming to be a friend or family member who is in need of money. If you receive a message on Facebook, even if it has come from the profile of someone you know, their account may have been hacked.

If a message claims to be from someone you know asking for money, find a way to speak to the person to verify it is them before taking any further action. Messages of this nature are highly likely to be a scam.

As always, if you need to report a crime or scam, please call 101 or 999 in an emergency.

## A CARER'S concerns over problems for dementia sufferers using taxis has led to over 200 drivers getting special training across Richmondshire.

The district's licensed taxi drivers have been trained in dementia awareness. Trainer Fiona Andrews from the charity 'Dementia Forward' said training is important for giving taxi drivers confidence helping people with dementia safely maintain independence. She added: "A client's daughter revealed her father had become fixated on returning to his

home town in the Midlands. He had approached a Richmond taxi driver with the request. Thankfully the driver declined the fare, but he might not have done so if the request had been to take him to Darlington, the man would have been alone in the town.

"In rural areas especially, taxis can be a lifeline and knowing that the drivers have had training and will understand the issues of living with dementia is reassuring for families," said Fiona. "The feedback from taxi drivers was really good.

"Dementia can hinder people from accessing support when they need it the most. Being able to get out and about is essential for some, and the local taxi service can become a lifeline. Knowing

that the taxi companies have had training and will understand the issues of living with dementia is reassuring for families."

News of this training has also spread to New York. The charity was approached by a group in

the city who had heard about the training it offered to more than 200 licensed taxi drivers in Richmond (currently celebrating 950 years since its founding). Since then a Zoom training session has been held with them prior to rolling it out for their taxi drivers. Fiona Andrews says 'We feel so proud that our small North Yorkshire charity has inspired such a wonderful group of people over there."

## Friends of St Andrew's Church, Moulton

The Friends of St Andrew's was set up in 2014. Its objective is to provide funds for the maintenance of St Andrews as both a church and a community facility.

When the village hall was demolished several years ago, residents of Moulton did not have a facility in which to meet or hold functions.

The community came together in 2009 and 2010 and raised funds and obtained grants to re-model the church that we see today – with pews removed and a flexible open space for events. The kitchen and toilet were also developed and we can now host a wide range of activities.

During the pandemic, the church held fewer services and also lost its regular exercise classes and whilst still advertising the church for public use, a lack of bookings results in the church being financially stretched.

The Moulton Village Association continues to support the church with donations and using the church for events.

If you are new to Moulton, you may not be aware of the Friends of St Andrew's fund. The fund pays for structural repairs and decoration and also finances insurance and some aspects of electricity costs which ensures the building remains in good condition. The costs of the ministry of the church remain with the church committee.

Should the current financial situation continue, the future of St Andrew's building being a facility for the village may have to be re-considered – an event many who live in Moulton would not wish to see come about.

Contributions of any size are welcomed on a regular basis (monthly, quarterly or annual standing orders are ideal) and one-off payments are equally welcome.
