We are taking donations for a memorial for Ken Etherington until the end of September, so if you haven't given anything yet but want to, you still have time.

Back in stock are the Middleton Tyas aprons, bags and mugs, all in the summer and winter versions. I like the winter ones myself, simple and monochrome, like me.

Also in stock now are the brilliant Mark Denton Its Grim Up North calendars, after Mrs Denton plonked a load on the counter the other day. RRP is £9.99 but because we like to not take the mickey, we sell them at £8.99. Beautiful scenes of Yorkshire with ironic descriptions. A fab gift or a place to stick loads of little post-it notes, like I do. Because I have no memory. I've not put them out yet because that's just silly in September, so do ask if you would like one, and our member of staff/volunteer will go a-hunting because I'll have forgotten to tell them where they are.

One of the many Lizzes in the shop stepped in in September between golf games and after I had remembered what we needed to bring/do etc (Jude was also my stunt memory), we got along famously. Even if I did manage to totally miscalculate the amount of bacon we needed. We usually have a few sausages to add in on request at no extra charge.

News from Neighbourhood Watch

Thank you for reading this Neighbourhood Watch page. Crime around Richmond has been relatively low in recent months and the chances of being a victim of burglary are still very low in Richmondshire. As the nights draw in however North Yorkshire Police hope that by considering the following points they can help make your homes and businesses less appealing to criminals.

Home Security Check

- · Do you have external motion censored lighting?
- · Do you have adequate locks on your sheds and outbuildings?
- Do you let your trusted neighbours know when you are away from your home address for long periods of time so they can keep an eye on your home?
- Do you have CCTV covering your drives and gardens?
- · Do you leave valuables in clear view of your windows?
- · Do you leave your car keys in view of your windows or close to your front door?
- · Do you advertise on social media when you are away from home?
- Do you remember to lock your doors and windows when you go out?

Gift card scam

An email is received which appears to be from a friend or colleague asking you to buy a number of gift cards -Google or Apple Pay. The email will usually be from someone you know (their email may have been hacked) and explains they can't buy the gift cards themselves because they are in a meeting or can't get to the shop but that they will pay you back as soon as they can.

The email will also likely ask you to photograph the cards once purchased and send them photos of the unique codes printed on each card.

This allows the scammer to use the gift cards to make online purchases and needless to say you will never see your money again. Typically the value of the gift cards is around £500.

If you receive an email like this, do not purchase any gift cards. If it is from someone you know, ring them to check if the request is really from them and if not then they need to be alerted their email may have been hacked.

Counterfeit vaccine passports

Now that travel and entertainment venues are opening up again, many places require proof of vaccination status in the form of an NHS Covid Pass. These can only be obtained via the NHS website, NHS app or by calling 111. Beware of fraudsters posing as NHS staff!
