Hello again, have you missed me? No. Oh, okay then. Be like that.

*Firstly*, other than you not missing me (won't sulk for long, just a week or two), is the sad news for anyone who didn't know of Ken Etherington's passing. A mainstay of the village for a very long time and a huge help to all sorts of people, Committees and Councils, he helped in the shop since before I even first plonked my feet and purse there. Sorting the papers on a Saturday morning and general cleaning in the afternoon – a man of routine, woe betide anyone who was standing on the mat by the till as they would be asked to step off so he could take it outside to give it a good bashing. Keen to help, he got his own log-in on the till which stayed there a long time after he was no longer needed on it – but then that could be because I'd forgotten how to delete log-ins. He will be greatly missed.

We are taking donations towards getting a memorial put in the Memorial Hall garden for Ken, a garden he put a lot of love and work into over the years. It would be a lovely way of remembering him.

*We* have a new beer in stock – the Treboom Yorkshire Sparkle – which is a strange name for a beer but then I don't drink the stuff so who am I to say. Yorkshire sparkle is what I hope to find in the bottom of a hole when I'm metal detecting, but its usually Yorkshire rusty iron, or my recent speciality, Yorkshire enormous horse shoe. Anyway, its a really pale ale with refreshing grapefruit flavours and hints of tropical fruits. Apparently.

Priced at £2.60 it joins our other Yorkshire beers and ciders on the top shelf, above the biscuits. Made by the Great Yorkshire Brewery, these are the Yorkshire Blackout (velvety chocolate and vanilla porter), Yorkshire Moors (unique hoppy and fruity aftertaste), Golden (with honey and caramel notes), Lager (earthy and slightly sweet), all selling at £2.50 for 500ml, and Yorkshire Cider (true medium and refreshing). And there we are, type Yorkshire enough times and it fills the page up nicely. We also sell Carling, John Smiths and Peroni, which aren't from Yorkshire.

**And** talking of biscuits, a new flavour from Bothams of Whitby (in Yorkshire) is coconut and ginger, which are lovely, with a capital love. The chocolate chip and ginger aren't so bad either and the just plain old ginger all on its ownsome are ever popular.

**Back** in stock is the Yorkshire Lavender room spray and the linen spray. Depending on the time of year, the wholesale price is a bit silly so these are rarely in – I only get them when the price comes down a bit and there is an offer on. See, I look after you don't I? Even when you don't miss me.

*This* month I've been mostly eating marmalade. Nom. Tiptree's Old Times or Orange and Tangerine, Mrs Darlington's thick cut, Mercer's English breakfast (Yorkshire). Perhaps that's why there's a faint tinge of orange to me, not sure. All delicious on my morning bloomer, honey and sunflower seed loaf, potato roll or petit pain, freshly baked at the shop in the morning (order the first two the day before).

*We* are still needing volunteers and after the overwhelming number of people (none) who came forward after my appeal for early morning shifters, maybe a Saturday morning is more your cup of tea, slice of toast with marmalade kind of thing? Our staff and volunteers have been amazing all through this rotten Covid time but obviously now with more freedom, they are going to see people not seen in a long time or having a well earned holiday, so we really need people to step up and get trained and be ready to fill any upcoming gaps. Have a think, maybe pop in for an hour or so to see if you are suited and we promise faithfully not to handcuff you to the till and bugger off to the Bahamas or anything.

*A* customer has asked that anyone who has clothes, blankets etc for the Afghan refugees holds off taking them anywhere until she's found out where a collection point is.

## New Equipment for the Community Speed Watch Team

We have been successful in obtaining a grant from RDC's North Richmondshire Community Partnership Fund to help us purchase all the equipment we need to run the Community Speed Watch project. This includes a Radar Gun, a counter, Hi-Viz jackets, 2 warning signs and a storage box. We are very grateful to RDC for their financial help. We can now return the equipment which we borrowed from NYCC, with our thanks to them for the loan and for help in setting up the scheme.

## And New Equipment for the Play Park

We are very happy to report that a bid to RDC's Richmondshire Play Park Funding Scheme 2021-2 for a grant of almost £10,000 to enable us to purchase a new piece of play equipment for the Play Park has been successful! We will be purchasing a new climbing net which will be a challenging replacement of our ageing climbing frame (anyone know how old it actually is?), and a first step towards the further refurbishment of the area. We are most grateful to RDC for their very generous support of this project.

Neighbourhood Watch is important because it is the way in which each one of us can make a worthwhile contribution to the safety and wellbeing of our communities.

A bit like the environmental slogan "Think globally, act locally", Neighbourhood Watch encourages each of us to behave in ways that contribute to a big idea which ultimately benefits our neighbours, friends and community through our small acts as individuals.

That is why when taking on this part of our local newsletter I hope that each month I may be able to share some specific ideas that you find useful, and which support the work of our

hardworking police and local authorities.

I am pleased to say that NY Police report that crime over the last few months has been relatively low around the Richmond rural areas. Most reports have been regarding anti-social behaviour and poaching. The total number of reports made is 45.

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) is warning the public to be vigilant of scam calls that appear to be coming from numbers similar to their own. Commonly, the first seven digits (07nnnn) match the victim's own number. The calls impersonate well-known government organisations, or law enforcement agencies, and will ask the recipient of the call to "press 1" in order to speak with an advisor, or police officer, about unpaid fines or police warrants. Government and law enforcement agencies will not notify you about unpaid fines or outstanding police warrants by calling or texting you. Do not respond to any calls or texts you receive about these.

## • If you receive a suspicious text message, you can report it by forwarding the message to 7726. It's free of charge.

## Suspicious telephone/mobile calls can be reported to Action Fraud via their website: actionfraud.police.uk/report-phishing
