Days are getting longer, spring is thinking about it, it's a faff to get into Richmond, Covid is becoming normal and I went to the tip the other day and was the only non-staff person there. Result. It was pouring with rain mind.

We are still collecting renewals and new members for our 100 Club. We are right down in numbers so if you want to support the shop this way, do renew or join. It's £24 for the year and you're then in for a chance to win vouchers to spend in the shop to the value of £30, £20 or £10.

Our lovely cakes come from Edwina's in Richmond and are collected by volunteers every Thursday. If you have any time to spare on a Thursday, middayish, and would be able to join our rota, please let me know. Currently we have four people on the rota so it wouldn't be an onerous task, and you get to collect cakes. Nowt better than collecting cakes, other than eating cakes.

After the spate of power cuts, I've been making more recycled candles to light us through those potential dark nights. £1 a candle and they'll be appearing in the Post Office bit soon. The last two cuts hit the shop and following hygiene regulations, we had to throw about £200 worth of stock. On that note, if you routinely have room in your fridge, even if its only half a shelf, we would be grateful if you would let us use it in the event of another power cut. I'm drawing up an emergency 'we have no power and the stuff is getting warm' plan, so would greatly appreciate offers of help – but obviously if you're on the same bit of grid as us, just ignore this!

Just some of our stock going cheaper in March as their use by dates get near will be mince pies and panetonne. Look out for deals on the right hand side of the counter.

If you buy something in the shop and see it labelled as 'Jacks, part of the Tesco group', it doesn't mean we've nipped down to Catterick to get our stock. Tesco bought Bookers, the cash and carry we use, and are slowly getting round to labelling stuff in this kind of confusing manner.

You'll hopefully have read in the last newsletter about Viv Pow and her Positivity Challenge to raise money for cancer charities. To this end, any money raised by the sale of second hand books, puzzles etc from our shed and inside the shop in March will go towards this fundraising. So get your reading specs on and have a look to see what we have.

After a long time without, we have finally managed to get our hands on some tomato juice. This is the same make as the lovely cloudy apple juice we sell (Cawstons) so undoubtedly the tomatoes are quite posh.

As things get back to normal and Boris releases us even more, we'll relax the one at a time rule in the shop to three customers at a time. Please do continue to wear your masks if you've remembered one, sanitise on entry and keep away from one another as best you can. We've managed so far not to get Covid from being in the shop and want to keep it this way, and we still need to protect our more vulnerable customers and staff. If more than one of us goes down with it at the same time, we may have to shut up shop until we're able to have a full complement of staff again.

#### **Phone Calls from Bogus Police Officers continue:**

Following the warning in last month's newsletter North Yorkshire Police have reported that unfortunately they are still seeing a number of reports of victims being contacted by someone claiming to be a police officer. This is an extract from the original message:

This 'police officer' goes on to claim they have arrested a person related to the victim who has attempted to buy a television or other high value item using the victim's bank card. The scammer will often give the victim a bogus reference number. The victim is instructed to attend their bank to withdraw money which will then be collected for safekeeping to protect them. The victim is further told that they must lie to the bank if they are challenged and say the money is to purchase a car or for building work or some other plausible excuse. This is of course false. Remember, the police or your bank will never contact you and ask you to move or transfer money. If you receive a call of this nature, hang up immediately, do not engage with the caller. make sure the telephone line is clear (i.e. the scammer is no longer on the line) and call 101. Please forward this alert onto family and friends.

### **News from National Neighbourhood Watch:**

We ran our second NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH CRIME AND COMMUNITY SURVEY between 20th October and 16th November 2021, to help us better understand: the impact of Neighbourhood Watch on levels of crime victimisation; fear of crime and feelings of safety; neighbourliness, community cohesion and loneliness; and the current reach and diversity of Neighbourhood Watch membership.

#### CRIME CONCERNS DIFFER NATIONALLY AND LOCALLY

One-fifth (20%) of over 14,000 people surveyed had been victims of a crime in the last year. Shockingly one-third (34%) of those had been harassed, threatened, or verbally abused in the street. Despite these being the crimes that most victims experienced, most respondents saw them as more of a national concern than a local concern. Almost three-quarters (74%) of respondents thought that violence against women and girls was a national concern yet only a quarter (24%) thought it was a local concern. Similarly with street harassment (72% v 32%), modern slavery (65% v 13%), hate crime (64% v 19%), domestic abuse (63% v 18%) and child exploitation (65% v 15%). There was a clear difference between how people viewed crimes locally and nationally, suggesting people don't think certain crimes, such as modern slavery, child exploitation, hate crime, domestic abuse and violence against women and girls, happen in their area.

As local elections approach, we are reminded that Neighbourhood Watch, as you may be aware, is a non-political organisation run by local people and of course many of our volunteers have been past councillors, are current councillors or are indeed running as new candidates to become a local councillor. This is because they are local people who are passionate about their communities, but Neighbourhood Watch is NOT party political.
