Planning Applications

There are two current planning applications with RDC for developments at Scotch Corner. Details of both can be accessed on the RDC website / Planning Portal at <u>www.richmondshire.org.uk</u> or by contacting RDC Planning Department at Mercury House, Richmond. (Reception: 01748 829100) Any queries, contact the Parish Clerk who will point you in the right direction.

1. EG Group are applying for Redevelopment of Roadside Services at Scotch Corner (i.e. the existing garage services at the top of the village). This will include the retention of the existing Petrol Filling Station and Forecourt, and the provision of a new Drive-thru Retail Outlet.

2. An Outline Application for Demolition of the Vacant Dalesway Lodge Motel and Restaurant; and the Construction of a Petrol Filling Station (sui generis) with Associated Kiosk/Shop (Use Class E) and Two Drive-Through Restaurants (sui generis), together with Construction of a New Vehicular Access, Car Parking, Electric Vehicle Charging Facilities and Other Works at Eastside, Barracks Bank, Scotch Corner.

Best Kept Village Competition 2022

Richmond Rotary are again organising this competition and we have entered. Judging will take place during the first 2 weeks of July. We did very well last year and hope to do the same, or better, this year. If you would like to help with general tidying of the village (litter, weed picking, etc) nearer the time, please get in touch.

Unrecorded Rights of Way

You may recall in issue 514 from October 2020, we asked that if you believed any paths through Middleton Tyas, in existence pre 1949, were not recorded on the Definitive Map and were at risk of being lost as a public Right of Way, then to get in touch.

We are delighted that the Government is to scrap the 2026 deadline for recording historic paths in England. This deadline has, for more than 20 years, threatened our footpaths. The deadline meant that on 1 January 2026, public rights over thousands of paths, which are public highways but not yet recorded as such, or not yet recorded correctly, would have been extinguished, with those rights being lost for ever. If a way is not recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement of Rights of Way, it can disappear under development.

On 16 February, the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) told the stakeholder working group (SWG: made up of representatives of users, landowners and farmers, and local authorities) that it would ditch the deadline, since considerable work remained to get the proposals ready for legislation. Defra, Natural England, and the SWG have been working on this since 2008.

What is certain however is that whilst we are fortunate to live in a relatively low crime area, it is very helpful to receive information from North Yorkshire Police about what are termed 'Incidents of note'. One of our local police team, Connor Mattison reports as follows:

'I'm pleased to say that crime over the last few months has been relatively low around the Richmond rural areas most reports have been regarding poaching and suspected poaching. The total number of reports made is 29.'

CURRENT SCAMS

In addition to the bogus police officer scam mentioned last month a recent scam noted by our police involves calls from Amazon stating you have credit on your account and that they wish to send you the money back. They will try to get you to do it on your computer, it won't work, and they will then ask to take control of your computer and proceed to clear out your bank account!

These people are very convincing and experts at what they do. They will usually sound very legitimate but please don't engage with them. Report any suspicious activity to the police.

POACHING

Historically as the evenings start to get darker poaching activity increases having a detrimental effect on both the local rural community and the wildlife in the area. Police ask landowners who witness this illegal activity to obtain as much information as possible including details of vehicles without compromising their own safety. The rural team will continue to patrol poaching hotspots alongside our Rural Task Force Colleagues whilst working closely with our Border watch volunteers.

If anyone is interested in becoming a Border watch volunteer, then please don't hesitate to get in touch with our local police team and they will happily provide you with more information.

Extract from RDC's Newsletter, 11th March 2022

Support for Ukraine

Richmondshire District Council is preparing to contribute to efforts to support the people of Ukraine following the invasion by Russian armed forces.

Council Leader, Councillor Angie Dale, explained: "We have a very proud tradition of responding positively to the heart-breaking consequences of conflict across the world. As a council we directly assisted in the Syrian refugee resettlement programme, and we are currently assisting Afghan refugees in the same way in partnership with our Ministry of Defence colleagues."

"We will contribute to coordinated efforts to assist the people of Ukraine in partnership with local councils and partner agencies across North Yorkshire. Experience has shown that by working together across North Yorkshire we produce the most positive and effective impact. We are awaiting further guidance from the Government on how we can best help. Once we have received guidance and associated requests we will be part of a coordinated North Yorkshire response."

"Please keep updated via our website and via social media."

Our local communities are already mobilising to support the people of the Ukraine. The Council is receiving enquiries and offers of help from residents across the district - but until further guidance is received from the Government it is difficult to give detailed advice at this point.

If residents wish to make financial charitable contributions to help Ukraine and the surrounding countries please be careful to give safely and not fall victim to fraudsters and fake charities. By giving to registered regulated charities you will have the assurance that your donation will go where it is really needed. As a basic safety check you can go to the <u>GOV.UK website</u> and always check the charity's name and registration number. Financial contributions can also be made via the <u>Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) appeal</u>.

The Council is also receiving offers of accommodation for Ukrainian refugees and these offers will be logged and responded to once more details are known.
