News from Neighbourhood Watch

North Yorkshire Police Information

We have just received information regarding January's crime figures for the Richmond rural area as a whole which showed a slight increase to 35, up from 25 in December 2022, including 7 offences in January in the Middleton Tyas Council Ward.

News Stories

A man has been arrested and interviewed on suspicion of a wildlife offence, breaching a dog control order and theft of a mobile phone. This was in relation to an investigation into badger baiting in the Richmondshire area.

42 drivers have been given a verbal warning and 8 drivers reported for having obscured registration plates. It is an offence to have an obscured registration plate due to several reasons. If your vehicle is stolen it makes it much harder for us to reunite it with its owner. But also if it is involved in a crime such as making off from a collision or leaving a petrol station without paying, it would be much harder for us to trace.

The Police would also welcome any information regarding the theft of 20 strimming machines from a farm at Eppleby early in the morning of 14 January which resulted in the loss of thousands of pounds worth of equipment. As a result, they have sent us a reminder about equipment and tool security as follows:

Equipment and tool security

Equipment and tool security can be a particular issue for rural businesses and farms.

To keep your belongings safe:

- · lock equipment away in a secure building or part of a building when not in use
- invest in a secure storage toolbox
- · install a burglar alarm on buildings where equipment is kept
- · always lock vehicles when left outside and keep the keys in your possession
- · keep expensive items and vehicles out of sight when not in use
- · consider using hitch locks, wheel clamps or ground anchors
- mark your tools and equipment and register them
- keep a record of all valuable items
- consider fitting outside security lights



A Note from Rev'd Alison Cozens

Lent: Lent is a time of fasting and prayer for Christians across the world, Anglicans, Catholics and Orthodox especially, remembering the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness and the 40 years the people of Israel spent in the wilderness before they reached they reached the Promised Land. Many of us will cook pancakes on Shrove Tuesday and then receive the ash on Ash Wednesday (made from last year's Palm Crosses). There are many ways to observe Lent, whether or not you are religious. You can take the 40 challenge and commit to one act of kindness, or one piece of exercise, or some such project each day of Lent. You might give up chocolate or wine and give a little more to the foodbank or to the Disaster Emergency Fund as we continue to think about our world and those people recovering from the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, and as we continue to pray earnestly for those who are working towards an end for the war in Ukraine. I am encouraging people to read the whole of one of the Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke or John. Read it as literature or as holy scripture or as just a good read. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is a special day and you might want to join us for Mothering Sunday on 19th March in one of our churches or to come and celebrate the end of Lent with us on Easter Sunday 9th April when I shall offer holy communion at Croft at 8am, Middleton Tyas at 9.30am and Barton parish church at 11am.
