## Scotch Corner Roundabout

If anyone has been wondering why traffic on the roundabout at Scotch Corner has been more 'delayed' than usual recently, we have the following information from National Highways in response to concerns raised by the Parish Council:

"Thank you for your email of 23 February about the traffic signals at Scotch Corner. I do understand your frustration as I regularly use Scotch Corner myself, so I'm aware of the delays this has caused, especially at peak times. Unfortunately, as there is a fault in the system, it has defaulted to a standard setting which, although frustrating to vehicle traffic, does ensure a potential for pedestrians to cross safely should they need to. We're currently working on temporary fix whilst we await a new part which should solve the problem. We've been given a lead time of 3 months for this part to arrive, which is why we're trying to work around it in the meantime. We have to ensure that our temporary fix also allows pedestrian access but without compromising the flow of traffic through the junction."

# **North Yorkshire Police Information**

I remain very grateful to North Yorkshire Police for most of the information contained in our Neighbourhood Watch page and particularly to our local PCSO Elliot Brown for sending me the local crime figures each month. In February there were a total of 4 crimes in the Middleton Tyas Ward, down from 7 in January. Other information and advice includes:

# Bike Safe Workshop

We offer BikeSafe workshops as part of our continuing drive to reduce road casualties.

It's a great opportunity to have your motorcycle skills assessed by one of our advanced police motorcyclists, with the aim of identifying areas of risk, improving your riding and make you a safer/more skilled motorcyclist.

Participants will learn about the significant benefits of investing further time in post-test motorcycle training (IAM, RoSPA and the DVSA Enhanced Rider Scheme). Ongoing training is the key to becoming a safer, more skilled rider and with this is the added benefit that riding a motorcycle becomes more enjoyable.


