Well, the Openreach team have been tasked with providing Full fibre broadband to 25,000 properties before the end of 2026. That is a big task, but it still means there will be many homes and properties in the UK without full fibre broadband. It is Important that we do not fall into the latter group. So. How do we do that?

The important thing is to ensure the Openreach team know about us and our burning desire to have full fibre broadband. There are no guarantees that this will work but it did when we were included in an early phase of the "Superfast" programme some years ago. So, all you need to do is to follow the link in the title of this article and register your interest. Thereafter check regularly on the website and if enough of us keep doing this we should be successful and enjoying reliable, superfast broadband which is 1000 times faster than the norm today.
