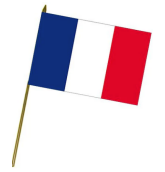

# News from Neighbourhood Watch

## Local Crime Information

Our local PCSO reports that in April of this year there was a total of 34 recorded crimes in the wider Richmond rural area (the same as March) and just two (both non-violent) in the Middleton Tyas Ward. He also passes on this:

### Property Marking

Dot peen marking involves using a tungsten carbide-tipped pin to indent an object with dots to create a visible, permanent unique reference.

The unique reference is then put into the national immobilise property register database.

Marking something like increases the chances that you'll get it back if it's lost or stolen. It also helps us to get convictions as evidence when something is stolen.

It can be marked on everything from steel and aluminium to plastic, so you can mark almost anything, from farming equipment, power tools, to electrical devices, bikes, and equestrian tack.

If you're interested in getting your property marked contact us and we'll get in touch with you to discuss what property needs marking and how and when we might be able to get it done.

PCSO Paul Enbom says: "My message to anyone coming to our beautiful and very fine area of Richmondshire is, if you speed, you are now much more likely to be caught and prosecuted. Depending on the level of speed, you may be offered a Speed Awareness Course or a roadside warning."

When do we want it ?

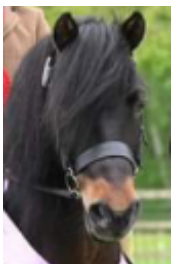
We want it now.....but, we aren't going to get it now!!!

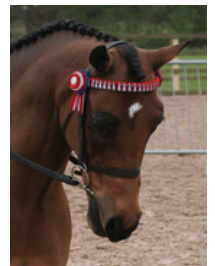

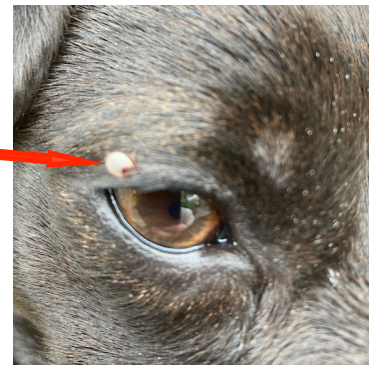

A reader sent a photo of a tick attached to her dog's eyebrow. They are unpleasant creatures which attach to an animal and behave like leeches. This tick would turn dark in colour as it continued to suck blood. The problem is that they carry Lyme Disease which is a bacterial infection. Humans can also get ticks. Please beware. If your pet (or you) get a tick use a special tick removal tool - make sure the head is totally removed. Also there are medicines available from the vet to protect against ticks and fleas. P.S.
