Co-option to Parish Council

We won't talk about needing new Parish Councillors this month other than to say that we still need to. Further information can be gleaned from any Councillor or the Clerk (07542 809 587).

Out of over 20 ex-Councillors identified as still living in the village, we received precisely 0 replies to our request to join a celebratory photograph as the Parish Council reaches 130 years old. If anyone has changed their mind, do let us know and we will arrange a convenient date.

Grant Funding for new Play Equipment

Our recent application for grant funding was not successful as the fund was over-subscribed before its closing date. We are continuing to look for new grant providers.

Finger Post on the Village Green

We are trying to dismantle the Finger Post so it can be taken away to be restored. The Finger Post actually belongs to NY Council, but there is an agreement in place that any maintenance work required must be carried out by the village, at our expense; failing that, NYC will remove it. As this Finger Post, and the one at the top of School Bank, are an integral part of the Conservation Area, we are keen to have it restored. We have found a company to do the work, but dismantling it is proving very difficult due to heavily rusted bolts. It is hoped to complete the work shortly.

Closure of Middleton Tyas Lane

This road will be closed from 28th October for 5 days to allow connection of a new build house to the main village sewer. Diversions will be in place via the Moulton LAR (opposite Scotch Corner Services), through Moulton and the bottom of the village. Please note that bus service 34 will also operate on this diversion to Moulton and any passenger will need to walk up to the end of Scurragh House Lane. Or you could leave the village along Lodge Lane (flooding permitting!) if you are heading to Barton/etc. The Clerk has a map if anyone would like a copy (clerk.mtyas@live.co.uk). The works may well be completed before you read this, depending on publication date.

# Winter is fast approaching here is a safety driving checklist

### Before you travel, you should:

- Think about whether your journey is necessary
- Check the latest weather forecast
- Plan to use main roads and check the gritting routes even if it puts a few miles onto your journey, but remember that they may still be icy
- Check the live weather cameras for an idea of the conditions
- Allow extra time
- Ensure you have glasses to the correct prescription
- Tell someone your plans
- Check whether you need breakdown or recovery insurance
- · Check your tyre pressure and tread depth, and your spare tyre
- Check your vehicle's lights are working and clean
- Check your wipers, and that you have screen wash containing anti-freeze
- Check that your car battery is in good condition and fully charged
- Check your windows and mirrors are clear of ice and condensation.
- · Check hat your car's windscreen is covered with a blanket overnight

# **Defibrillator**

There is a Defibrillator which has been installed on the wall of the Memorial Hall. It is easily accessible through the iron gates on the corner. If needed during the night time it is well lit. If you have NOT already called 999 please do so ASAP. There is a telephone on the wall on the left hand side of the Defibrillator cabinet - press the button for assistance.

The Defibrillator is NOT locked. To access the Defibrillator, turn the clear cabinet front anticlockwise. It will come loose and then you can grab the Defibrillator bag. Do not

worry about the front falling to the ground. In an emergency getting the Defibrillator is all that matters. (The front can be replaced!)

If you need the kit please make sure that after the event you email either Christine Bryant - christine.bryant56@gmail.com; or the Clerk to the Parish Council - clerk.mtyas@live.co.uk. Christine B will make sure that the Defibrillator is checked and made ready for use once more so it is important that you let her know if it has been used. Thank you.

### A Second Defibrillator for Moulton

We now have a second defib in the village. It has been installed on West Ridge below the stairs and above the bins!

The purchase was made possible by a grant from Councillor Thompson's Locality Budget, a contribution from the 'defib fund" that we created when the Black Bull defib was purchased and a generous contribution from a resident. A further resident has kindly funded the electrical work that was needed.

Hopefully, the defib will not be needed. If there is a need, as with the other defib, ring 999 first and advise there is a defib in the village at West Ridge - they should be able to find it. Postcode is DL10 6QF.

Thanks once again to those who have made this possible.

### Defibrillator familiarisation session

A session for Moulton residents will be held in St Andrew's Church on Tuesday January 7<sup>th</sup> at 6.30 pm. It has been a while since we held a familiarisation session and Yorkshire Ambulance Service are able to deliver this for us.

The session usually lasts no more than an hour. They will explain what happens when you dial 999, how the call is triaged and how the defib works. There will be a training defib available and a manikin to show how the defib works and how to check if a person is breathing and how to do CPR.
