News from Neighbourhood Watch

Local Crime Information

Our local PCSO Elliot Brown reports that in July of this year there was a total of 44 recorded crimes in the wider Richmond rural area and 8 in the Middleton Tyas Ward which covers Scotch Corner and Moulton as well as Middleton Tyas itself.

Police Appeal for Assistance

Police are appealing for information about a burglary that took place at a farm in Moulton. It happened between 5pm and midnight on Friday 12 July, at a farm in Moulton. Two men dressed all in black wearing balaclavas and gloves stole a red Honda 420 Quad bike. It is believed that the men have pushed the quad bike over a field then made off with it towards the Darlington area. We're particularly appealing for information about any suspicious activity that was seen around Back Lane between Friday 12 July and Saturday 13 July. Also, any information of vehicles that may have been seen on Back Lane, Moulton between 5pm and midnight on Friday 12 July.

A Message from Andrew Hindhaugh August 2024

To my mind an old village is missing something if it has no church.

People who run our churches are invariably involved in all sorts of activities and so almost unwittingly they help provide an underlying heartbeat to the village.

At our last meeting of the Parochial Church Council I promised to write this article to bring two matters to your attention so please be kind enough to read on.

Our last major financial appeal for St. Michaels and All Angels was in 2001 and I am happy to report that we are not about to start another.

For some years, the Friends of St Michaels fund has existed to provide money purely for the maintenance of the building with nothing to do with the actual religious activities and it helped us cope with major roof repairs in 2022. Even so we had a deficit of £21,000 that year. Thankfully during 2023 grants helped us recoup over £16,000.

Anyway, since the fund was established, many of the original supporters are no longer with us and many newcomers to the village will have no idea such a fund exists so that is matter number one.

Another fund we have is the Legacy Fund and as most of us like the idea of a church being available for births, marriages and deaths some think that would be a rather appealing idea.
