Appeal / Updates

Earlier in the month whilst conducting our Rural Crime Patrols at the top end of Richmondshire, we came across a stolen blue Ford Transit registration number, MV62HWS which was towing a silver Ifor

Trailer. The stolen vehicle and trailer were subsequently abandoned in the vicinity of Eppleby, and I strongly suspect these people were about to target somewhere for quad bikes to load onto the trailer.

We are appealing to you today is firstly to ask that if you are missing a silver Ifor Trailer, or you saw this vehicle and have any evidence to provide for us, then I would appreciate it if you would ring 101 quoting reference number 12230241821 please.

Appeal / Updates

Overnight 2 quad bikes were stolen in the Scorton area. Investigations are currently ongoing regarding the incident. If you have seen anything suspicious or have any information that could be linked to the thefts please get in touch on 101, quoting incident reference NYP-12122023-0189.

Please ensure any garages or sheds are secured with good locks and security measures are in place. We strongly advise fitting a shed/garage alarm which can be purchased for as little as £10 from DIY stores or online, they are battery operated and are very easy to fit. It's also a good idea to lock items together or to a secure fitting inside your building using a cable lock or chain.

Your local police team are aware and have the area on their patrol plan.

Estate and building security

A good standard of building security is very important in rural areas, especially for outbuildings that may not be visited for weeks at a time.

Farmhouses and other rural properties are the same as any other home, so general home security advice still applies.

However, because of the remote location, additional security measures may be beneficial.

To protect your rural home or business:

Keep the boundaries of your land and property well-maintained and secure

Keep all doors and windows shut and locked when not in use

Install a visible burglar alarm

Make sure windows and door frames are secure and in good repair

Fit strong locks to sheds, garages and outbuildings

Fit good quality window locks

Consider security bars and grilles for vulnerable windows and openings

Make sure gates cannot be lifted off or have their fixing bolts removed

Check security equipment regularly to ensure it works properly

Use locking posts or temporary obstructions to control wide access points to yards
