Dalton-on-Tees Vehicle Crime

During the early hours of the 14th October at approximately 02:15 am, 2 suspects attempted to gain entry into a vehicle in the Dalton-on-Tees area. Thankfully they were spooked off before they entered. Therefore, we are appealing for any information if anyone has CCTV cameras within the area who may have captured footage of the suspect or a vehicle involved in the incident.

As a reminder please ensure your properties and vehicles are secure and locked. If you have a keyless car ensure your keys are in a faraday type bag or as far away from the front door as possible.

Brompton-on-Swale Burglaries

Police are investigating a burglary which occurred on Wednesday 29th October sometime between the hours of 22:00 and 22:45 at 2 properties within Brompton-on-Swale Industrial Park, Station Road, Brompton-on-Swale.

Police are particularly interested in a Volkswagen Passat / Jetta, silver in colour in the area around the time of the incident.

Do you have any information which would assist North Yorkshire Police in finding those responsible and help keep your community safe?

Did you or anyone who you live with, hear or see anything around the above time and date?

Do you have any CCTV coverage capturing the burglary, or anything happening on the street before or after?

Do you have a vehicle with a dash-cam parked in the area?

Distraction burglary

Distraction burglars pretend to be someone they are not in order to gain entry to your home.

Common methods used by distraction burglars

Pretending to be from a care agency, the council or a utility company investigating a gas or water leak seeking help to leave a note for a neighbour or even asking for a drink of water if they claim to be thirsty or unwell

Claiming to be in a hurry or emergency and needing to get into your home quickly Working in teams, with one person distracting you while the other searches your home

How to prevent it

There are a number of things you can do to prevent distraction burglary. Don't be afraid to ask questions about anyone at your door – genuine callers won't mind. Always remember 'if in doubt, keep them out':

Use your door viewer to see who's there If you open the door put the chain on first

Always ask for ID and check it with the company before letting somebody into your home
Use the phone number advertised in the phone book or online, as the number on their identity card could be fake. For a utility company, call the customer service department. Close the door while you do this if you feel at all unsure, schedule a time for the caller to come back when a friend or relative is there

For pre-planned appointments with utility companies, a password scheme can be set up
